A: Inscription in four lines:  $\iota\omega|\sigma\alpha\beta\alpha\omega\alpha|\beta\rho\alpha\xi\iota\omega$  the last line is illegible → Ἰάω, variant of Σαβαώθ, variant of Ἀβρασάξ, Ἰάω, unidentified vox.

B: Frontal view of a cock-headed Anguipes in armour, head to right. Whip in the right hand, shield in the left hand.
