A: Harpocrates sitting nude, with knees drawn up, to right on a lotus flower with two buds, which rests upon a papyrus boat. Left hand raised to mouth, right hand holding a flail. Around, triads of animals, clockwise from the top: scarabs, falcons, crocodiles, goats.

B: Inscription in six lines: $\beta \alpha \iota \nu \chi | \omega \omega \chi \omega \iota | \alpha \omega \omega \lambda \omega | \rho \chi \epsilon \rho \sigma \epsilon | \nu \eta \epsilon \nu \epsilon | | \nu \theta \omega \rightarrow B \alpha \ddot{\iota} \nu \chi \omega \omega \omega \chi$, Iάω, voces unidentified.

A praxis known from a papyrus (PGM LXI 1-38) specifies that love charms had to be incised with the image of Horus on a lotus flower and the magical name Abraxas. Pieces with the Horus-scheme used as love charms: <u>CBd-533</u>, <u>CBd-534</u>.
