Inscription around, beginning above the tail of the horse: εισθεοσονικωντακακα  $\rightarrow$  είς θεὸς ὁ νικῶν τὰ κακά. 'The sole god, who overcomes evil.' Below, roaring lion striding in profile to right.

B: Inscription in three lines: ιαωσα|βαωθμιχ|αηλβοηθι → Ἰάω Μιχαήλ Σαβαώθ, βοήθ<ε>ι and characteres. 'Iaw, Sabaoth, Michael, help!'
