On the left: Chnoubis-sign and inscripiton running from top to bottom: $\chi\nu\sigma\nu\mu\iota\sigma \to \chi\nu\sigma\nu\mu\iota\varsigma$.

B: Inscription in three lines: ηλιαν|βρωαβραμ|αωθανοχ → ηλιαμβρω, variant of αβραμμαωθ, Άνοχ. Post-antique?
