A: Rider on horseback, with a nimbus around the head, to right, striking a long-haired figure lying on the ground, with a spear. Inscription around, beginning on the left: εἰς θεὸς <ὁ> νικῶν τὰ κακά. 'The sole God, who overcomes evil.'

B: At top, an eye, fixed with nails and trident, and attacked from below by two lions flanking a snake and a scorpion.
