**A:** Ouroboros, with head at top to left, encircling a uterus-symbol in the shape of a cupping vessel and a six-bitted key. Above the uterus, a group of deities, from left to right: a falcon(?) -headed mummy, to right, wearing a crown(?); lion-headed Chnoubis in profile to left, without rays; female figure (Isis?) to left, with the modius on her head, wearing a long robe and holding an unidentified object in her left hand. Greek inscription around the Ouroboros, starting at bottom left: στραπιναποκαινειαλλυχνουωρωζοερουχω → unknown voces. Inside the Ouroboros, the Greek vowel series above the figures: αηιο, next to the uterus on the two sides: υ ω.

**B:** Greek inscription in seven lines:

τασσουντημητραν|τησδειναισ|τονιδιοντο|πουοτουκυκ||λοντουηλει|ου → τᾶσσουν τὴν μήτραν τῆς δεῖνα εἰς τὸν ἴδιον τόπον <ὡς> τὸν κύκλον τοῦ ἡλ<ί>ου. 'Put the womb of NN to its proper place as (you move) the solar disk.'
