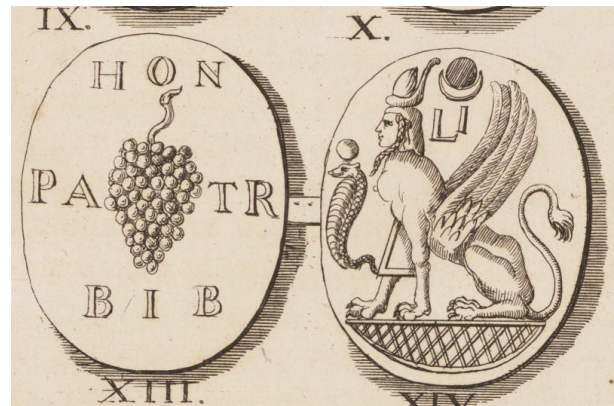


Drawing of a magical gem: Inscription, bunch of grapes (A) uraeus and sphinx (B)

Rights:

A: A bunch of grapes and an inscription in Latin letters, arranged in three lines in the free field: hon|pa tr|bib → Hon(ori) Patr(is) Bib(eri) - Du Molinet.

B: Sphinx, part male, part female, sitting in profile to left on a basket formed like the hieroglyph heb. The sphinx wears the nemes-headdress or a wig(?), has a side-lock of youth, and is crowned with the double-crown of Egypt. In front of the sphinx, a uraeus with the solar disk on its head, facing left. Above the figures: two letters: LI, and a crescent with the solar disk.
