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A: Anubis standing in profile to left, wearing shoes and kilt, upper body nude. Right hand holding a staff, left hand holding a situla. Below, upside down, a female figure wearing a long robe (Isis?). To the right of the figures, inscription vertically in two lines, from top to bottom: αβλαναθα|ιηαιιοα → variant of Ἀβλαναθαναλβα, vocales.

B: Osiris mummy, to front, head crowned and surrounded with animal protomes. Below, upside down, remains of an Anguipes, only the snake's legs and the armour visible. In the free field beside the figures, letters and characteres. On the right, inscription vertically, from top to bottom: σεμσειλαμ.
